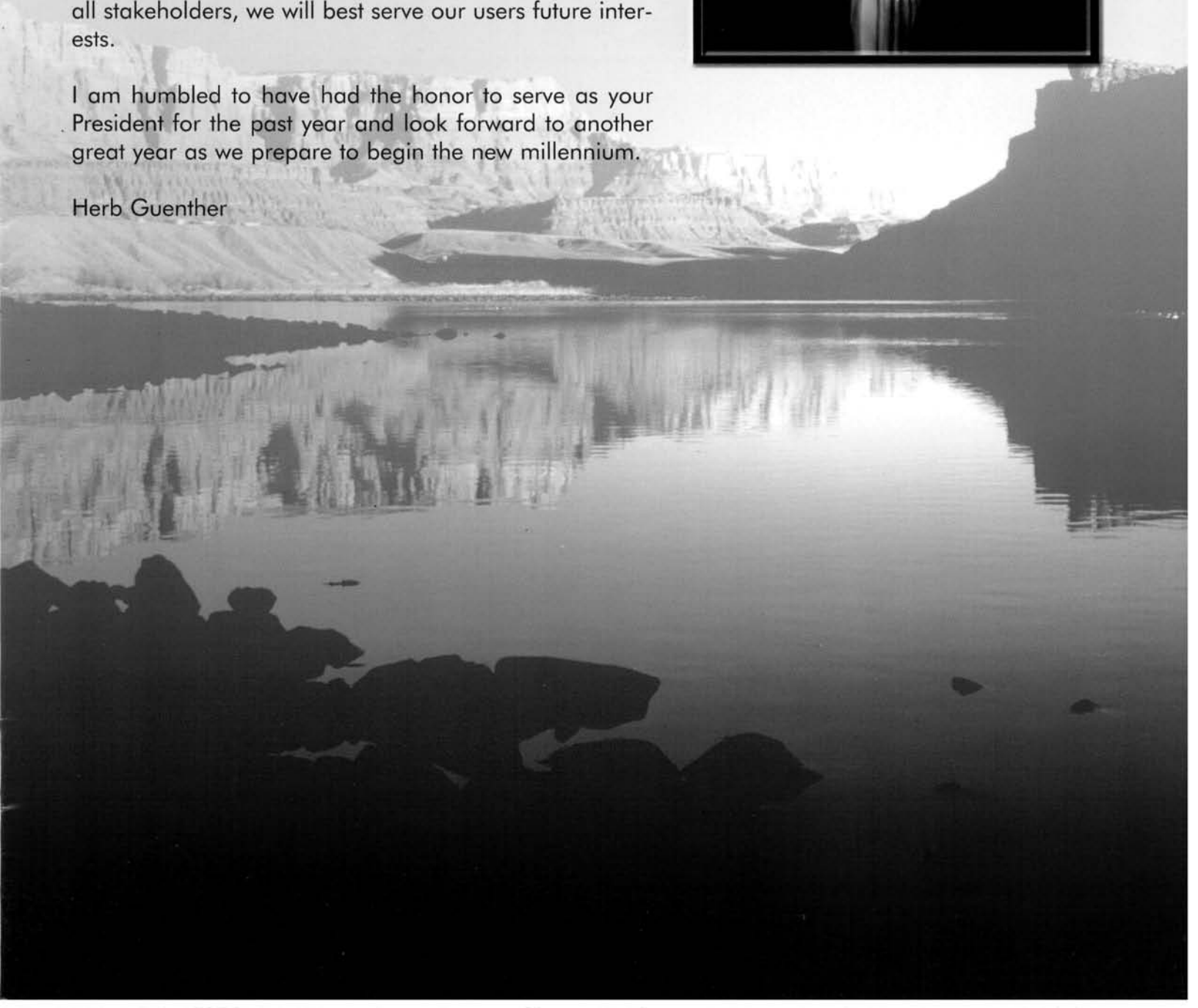
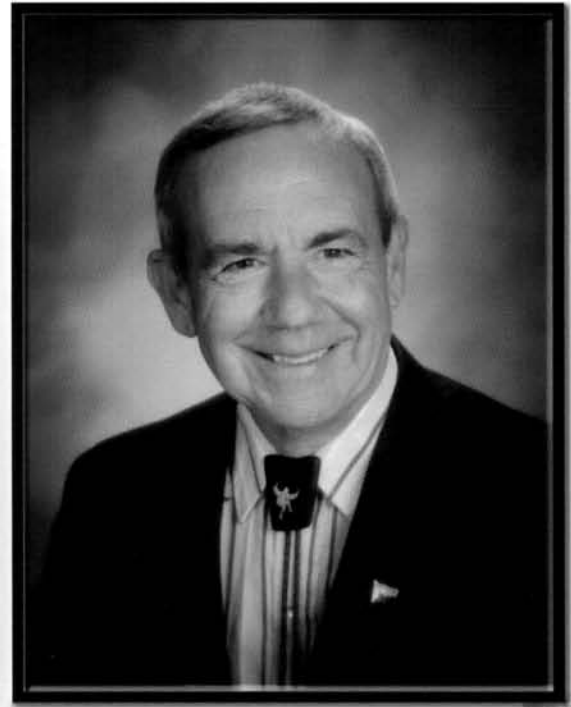
President's Report

President Guenther reported the board of trustees had accepted in full, the reports from the committees.
