


PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Resolution Titles

- **2001-1** Endangered Species Act CRWUA supports implementation, reform, and reauthorization of the Endangered Species Act, subject to specified conditions.
- 2001-2 Clean Water Act The CWA shall not be utilized to regulate anything other than point or non-point sources of pollutants to water of the United States.
- 2001-3 Reclamation Changes to project benefits, operations or environmental mitigation requirements shall not adversely impact existing contractual or water rights.
- 2001-4 Colorado River Salinity Control Congress and the Administration should adequately fund and implement in a timely and cost-effective manner, measures to control Colorado River salinity.
- 2001-5 Compliance with State Law The Federal Government shall comply with all applicable state laws and regulations regarding water,
- 2001-6 Settlement of Indian Reserved Rights The CRWUA supports, subject to recognition of specified factors, settlement of Indian reserved water rights by negotiation or agreement.
- 2001-7 Safe Drinking Water Supplies Protection of safe public drinking water supplies is of primary importance. EPA should provide adequate flexibility to public water suppliers to use their financial and technical resources to provide optimum public health protection.
- 2001-8 Safe Drinking Water Act States should have flexibility over state capacity development programs for existing systems. EPA should provide flexibility in implementing consumer confidence report requirements.
- 2001-9 Rural Community Water and Sewer Systems Drinking water and sewer systems developed under USDA programs shall be protected.
- 2001-10 Funding The Upper Colorado and San Juan River Basin Endangered Fish Species Recovery Programs The CRWUA supports appropriation of cost-sharing funds by federal and state interests for the Upper Colorado and San Juan River Basin Endangered Fish Species Recovery Programs.
- 2001-11 Lower Colorado River Multi-Species Conservation Program The CRWUA supports the development of a Lower Colorado River Multi-Species Conservation Program and Congressional funding for this effort.
- 2001-12 Support of the amendment to the Colorado Ute Water Rights Settlement Act The CRWUA supports the compromise adopted by the two Colorado Ute Indian Tribes and water users to proceed with a revised Animas La Plata Project within the existing environmental constraints.
- 2001-13 En Libra Doctrine for Environmental Management The CRWUA supports the En Libra doctrine and urges application of these principles in addressing and resolving environmental management conflicts and issues.
- 2001-14 Uranium Mill Tailings Pile Near Moab, Utah The CRWUA urges the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the U.S. E.P.A. to actively pursue protection of Colorado River water supplies with regard to the Atlas Corporations's uranium mill tailings pile near Moab, Utah.
- 2001-15 Federal Actions to Designate or Redesignate Lands Designation or redesignation of lands shall not impair existing water rights or uses, nor shall such designation create any water right.
- 2001-16 Critical Importance of maintaining Water and Power Infrastructure on the Colorado River Federal dams and their reservoirs provides significant regional and national benefits. Removal, bypass or breaching of federal dams in the Colorado River Basin and restricting or abrogating a state's right to manage or control its water resources in accordance with existing law is opposed.

BUSINESS SESSION

Annual Meeting

The business session of the 2000 annual meeting of the Colorado River Water Users Association was called to order by President Virgil Jones on Friday, December 15, 2000, at Caesars Palace in Las Vegas, Nevada.

President Jones thanked the Program Committee and everyone who helped organize the conference. He said this is not a paid organization; everyone is a volunteer. President Jones asked Secretary-Treasurer Levy to conduct the business session.

Mr. Levy asked for a hand for Bernardine Sutton and the committee chairs and members for their work.

Mr. Levy reported the board had accepted in full the reports from the committees and asked if there were any questions on the reports. Being none, it was moved, seconded and carried that the reports be accepted as presented.

Mr. Levy said the officers and directors of the association are elected for two-year terms. The current slate of officers will remain in office until the next election which is scheduled for the annual coference in 2001. The directors also remain in office through 2001 except in the case of vacancies. He asked any caucus that had a change in its directors for 2001 to present its report.

New Mexico reported that Jim Dunlap was elected to replace Albert Keller who passed away in May.

Wyoming reported that Ben Bracken was elected to replace Gordon Fassett due to his resignation.

The Colorado River Indian Tribes Partnership reported that Claudia Vigil-Muniz was elected to replace Joe Muniz due to his resignation.

Mr. Levy called on Karen Tachiki, chairman of the resolutions committee, for a report. Mrs. Tachiki thanked the members of the committee for their work throughout the year. The state caucuses approved the

resolution packet as amended by the committee.

Mrs. Tachiki said the committee requested the discretion to make editorial or grammatical corrections as needed before printing the resolutions.

It was moved, seconded and carried to approve and adopt the resolution package as amended.

Mr. Levy said there being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.
